Walking

Our oldest son Noah walks on May 11th. He is graduating from Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts majoring with honors in Sociology, and minors in Anthropology, Social Work, and History. (I call him a SASH major). I'm looking forward to seeing him sitting alongside his classmates patiently waiting for his name to be called and then walking across the stage when his name is called with his parents cheering like crazy (if it's allowed). Noah didn't get to walk in high school as his high school graduation occurred during COVID. They had a much more intimate setting graduation celebration. It involved walking across a parking lot in the cap and gown to a tent where the diploma was handed to him by a person of his choice (in our case Sara). It was cool, but didn't feel like a graduation.

I'm glad he gets to make the walk across a real stage this time, and try to remember to shake with the right hand and get the diploma with the left, flip the tassel and then gleefully leave the stage to the applause of a bunch of people he doesn't know honoring what he has done. But then comes the interesting part, what's next? You did this, what's next young man. Full of youth, talent and a hopeful amount of idealism, what will you do? I can't wait to see.

Our church walked across the stage on March 3rd and declared ourselves a welcoming and affirming congregation. We are now listed on the Association of Welcoming and Affirming Baptists, and I celebrate the step of inclusion that we have taken.

But for us this is not an ending, anymore than a graduation is an ending. It is the beginning of something more, in the same way that baptism is the start of a grown up and owned spiritual life, our brave embrace of the other changes us and that makes everything new.

Think about how we can make our building and service more accommodating to those with physical and mental challenges. Imagine how we can be more inviting to LGBTQ friends who don't know yet they have an advocate and (to quote story) a friend in us. Pray about how we should involved ourselves in the age old/new again struggle between the Palestinians and the Jewish people that is ripping up campuses and unsettles us all. (October 7th was horrific, the Israeli response has also become so.)

Our calling is to do all this and more. What's wonderful is that God has equipped us for just this job. We each have the capacity to love, to put aside personal politics and personal theology, and just love the other. Don't overthink it. Don't allow our self-righteous self (that part of us usually formed when we were young that learned somewhere that our way is the ONLY way, and those who disagree are less) to get in the way of Jesus' clear and message of love and acceptance.

I'm excited that like Noah, it's our turn to walk, to flip the tassel and move on to what's next.

I'm even more excited I get to do this with all of you!

170th Church Anniversary

First Baptist Church, 1872-1874

As First Baptist Church approached the end of its second decade of existence, it had faced many challenges. During these years the issue of stability in the pastorate remained a thorny one, as a series of one-year tenures continued. In June of 1873 the church called A.A. Russell, but tragedy soon came. Mrs. Russell, described as a tireless worker, and a "lady loved by all," passed away and soon thereafter Rev. Russell resigned. On the first Sunday of September in 1874 the pastorate of Richard Garton began, a pastorate that was to continue for 12 prosperous years. The church had a membership of 276.

Despite short pastorates and a badly damaged steeple from a severe windstorm in 1874, all other signs of health for this growing church were good. In 1872, when the bridge to the east side was out, the church started a mission Sunday School in the Free Will Baptist Church, but this endeavor lasted only a few months.

The most important development of this period might well be the first meeting of the church's Woman's Foreign Mission Society on December 31, 1873.
